

Route 1: Exploring the famous Lysefjord

(Note that tent campers in public recreation areas are limited to two days per campsite.)

- **Start from Stavanger, Tau or Jørpeland:** There are bunkering facilities for private boats at Tau and Jørpeland. A popular recreation area is Tøgjevågen in Skyljarvik, northeast toward Fiskå not far from Tau. In the cove here are mooring bolts, toilets, waste disposal and recycling station.

- **Note!** Remember to re-fuel your boat at Bergevika, on the south shore at the mouth of the Lysefjord – as there are no bunkering facilities along the 42 km long fjord!

- **Dørvika** is the next stop, a cove that lies on the southern shore of the Lysefjord, approx. 6 km northeast of Forsand village centre. This sheltered cove has a sandy

beach, and there are sloping rockfaces that are perfect for angling on the headland. The area is ideal for swimming, fishing, recreation, and nature walks. Please note that tent campers in Norway are limited to two nights per campsite.

Accommodation is available at the Lysefjorden Marina in Bergevika in Forsand village centre, with flats for hire. Reservations recommended. There is also a grocer and bakery here. The Lysefjord Centre, on the northern shore of the Lysefjord, offers an excellent Sunday buffet.

- **Lysebotn:** Innermost in the Lysefjord is a campsite for tents, that also has cabins, a bed & breakfast, and a hostel. Café and bar. From Lysebotn you can watch base jumpers throw themselves from Kjerag – or ascend the summit yourself.

- **Flørli:** Here, on the southern shore of the Lysefjord, there is accommodation in mountain lodges. Are you in good shape? Climb the 4444 stone stairs at Flørli! Or relax and enjoy a hot meal or cold refreshments at Flørlikafeen. Contact us for information on food and accommodation.

- As you leave the Lysefjord, you may be tempted to visit **Lådervik**. The beautiful coves here, northeast at Idsal between the Idsefjord and Høgsfjord, are ideal for those enjoying a boating holiday. You will find a toilet, a small pier for disembarking, mooring spots, a barbecue area, waste disposal and recycling station, and an information board. Accommodation is available at Solvik Camping, a sheltered cove near Jørpeland. Call ahead to reserve rooms and a spot for your boat.

- Return to your point of origin – **Stavanger, Tau or Jørpeland**.
