

## Suggested route from Haugesund

(Note that tent campers in public recreation areas are limited to two days per campsite.)

- Start your journey from **the town of Haugesund or the nearby island of Karmøy**
- Recreation area on **Borgøy in the Hervikfjord**: Nature and cultural trail, swimming, natural harbour, wharf for disembarking, and mooring bolts.
- **Nord-Talgje in Sjernarøyane archipelago**: The area consists of islands, skerries and islets, sounds and many sheltered coves – a very popular boating destination, with space for everyone. Facilities include toilets, mooring hooks, waste disposal and recycling station, and information signs. Land-based accommodation is available at Helgøysund Fiskesenter at Helgøysund, but do call ahead for reservations. In addition, there is Eldhuset bed & breakfast at Nord-Hidle near Hidlesundet sound, which is well known for its excellent home cooking!
- **Rossøysundet (Finnøy)**: A peninsula, sound and island at Fogn's southern point. The coast here is characterised by sloping rockfaces, and sheltered coves and sounds that offer many tempting places to cast anchor. Facilities in the area include handicap toilet, waste disposal and recycling station, guest harbour and marked trails. Accommodation is available at Finnøy Fjordsenter (on the eastern shore of Finnøy, at Nåden, south of Judaberg), where there are cabins and camping with sanitary facilities and other amenities. In Judaberg you can re-fuel 24 hours a day with a credit card or bankcard.
- **Steinessvåg (Finnøy)**: In this cove on the west side of Finnøy lies Finnøy Havsenter, where you can rent one of the newly built flats, savour a good meal in the restaurant, relax in the Spa, and enjoy use of the guest harbour facilities. Organising diving trips for those seeking underwater adventure. The nearby Hesby church is worth a visit.
- **Hammaren**: This recreation area at the entry of the Førlandsfjord is a natural harbour that has a wharf for disembarking, mooring bolts and a toilet.
- Return to **Haugesund or Karmøy**
